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

Corporate Secretaryship	Arogya Daan - The Department of Corporate Secretaryship organised Arogya Daan, a medical camp for the students of the CSI Higher Secondary School for the Deaf, Santhome. The students were provided basic medicines, food and toiletries, and a free medical check-up and nutrition counselling were also organised
4	2017-18	B.Sc. Computer science B.C.A M.Sc. IT	Gyaan Daan - The Department of Computer Science undertook an initiative to provide computer skills to less-privileged children. Around 30 students of Ananya -The Learning Center of Madras Dyslexia Association were given intensive skill training. The Department of Computer Science comprising M.Sc. (Information Technology), B.Sc. (Computer Science) and B.C.A. were involved in this programme. The training programme was for ten days from the 27th of June to the 7th of July 2017. The training programme was divided into two parts — the use of basic designing and publishing skills was taught to senior students and basic computer and presentation skills were imparted to junior students. M.O.P. student trainers volunteered to take up this project and put in extra hours of work beyond college working hours. Since the school did not have adequate computer facilities, the students of the department took their personal laptop to ensure 1:1 teacher: learner ratio.
5	2017-18	B.Sc. Electronic Media	Vrihi Daan - Addressing the lack of food for stray animals in and around the city, the Department of Electronic Media decided to provide grains and food to cows, dogs and other domestic animals. This service was rendered on the 14th of December 2017 at the Marina Beach, Shankara Matam Ghoshala, Shree Hall Mandapam and Besant Memorial Animal



The food items collected from students of the department included biscuits, bread, jowar, makka (maize), green gram, chickpea, and rice. Around 5 a.m., the students assembled at the Marina Beach to feed the pigeons. The grains were spread for the pigeons in the form of a swastika symbol. Immediately flocks of pigeons landed on the sands to feast on the grains. Similarly, the students went to Shree Hall Mandapam on Burkit Road, T.Nagar, and spread the pigeon feed on its terrace. Then the students went to Shankara Matam Ghoshala where the cows were fed with cattle feed. Besides, small toys and blankets were provided to the animals at the Besant Memorial Animal Dispensary.</p>
6	2017-18	B.Sc. FSM M.Sc. FTM	<p>Anna Daan - The School of Food Science contributed towards the Daan effort by organizing an 'Anna Daan' on the 27th of December 2017 at Little Sisters of the Poor Home for Aged, Chetpet. Part of the profit from the department's in-campus bakery, 'Beyond Breads,' was channelled into this effort, to procure household materials and other essentials. The home, which was started in 1934, currently has around 120 residents. The students of the Department experienced the joy of giving during the Christmas season by visiting the residents of the home and donating groceries and baked goods. The residents were delighted to have the students amidst them and interacted happily. They shared their childhood experiences and advised them on how they need to face challenges in daily life. It was a pleasant and enriching experience for the volunteers.</p>
7	2017-18	B.A. Journalism	<p>Samay Daan - In this year of Daan, students of the department of Journalism undertook a community service project to donate the most precious commodity of modern life, 'Time.' The students decided to focus their efforts on a cohort often neglected even by charitable organisations — Senior Citizens. As part of the project, dubbed 'Samay Daan,' the students first visited an elder-care facility and spent time with residents, engaging them in board games and</p>

The students also took the campaign to their own neighbourhood, by meeting and talking to senior citizens such as street vendors, and documenting their experience in the form of short essays and photographs.
