#### **Program Description:**



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

The Parliament of Singapore is the unicameral legislature of the Republic of Singapore, which governs the country alongside the President of Singapore Largely based upon the Westminster System, the Parliament is made up of Members of Parliament (MPs) who are elected, as well as Non-Constituency Members of Parliament (NCMPs) and Nominated Members of Parliament (NMPs) who are appointed. Following the 202 general elections, 93 (currently 92) MPs and two NCMPs were elected to the 14<sup>th</sup> Parliament.

The delegates visited the Parliament's Public Gallery and were then taken on a guided tour inside the Parliament. Videos were shown to educate the participants about the history and formation of the Parliament. The delegated were given a real-time experience of Parliament's sitting and policy making.

The session came to an end after a brief Question & Answer session between the dignitaries and delegates.

#### **Program Description**




#### **Program Outcomes**

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

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# WOMEN IN POLITICS & NATION BUILDING DIALOGUE SESSION WITH PUTERI-MALAYSIAN CONGRESS

DATE: 12.12.2022

#### **Program Objectives**

- To learn about the party's history and formation.
- To understand the role of women in politics.
- To identify the methodology in functioning of the party.
- To realize the party's mission and vision in view of its evolution.
- To appreciate the young women's wing of MIC-Indian Origin Political Party.
- To recognise the party as a ruling coalition in the federal government.

#### **Program Description**

The MIC was established in August 1946 to advocate for Indian independence from British colonial rule. After India gained its independence, MIC turned its focus to the struggle for the independence of Malaya (now Malaysia), which was achieved in 1957. It positioned itself to represent the Indian community in Malaya in the post- World War II development of the country. The MIC, the United Malays National Organisation and the Malaysian Chinese Association formed the National Alliance in 1954. The National Alliance incorporated additional parties and became the Barisan Nasional in 1973.

The session started with a warm welcome from Mr Kishva Ambigapathy (Youth Wing) and Dr.Ramu (Leader of Malaysian Indian Youth Council-Malaka District) followed by an address from Ms Shaliny Rajaram (Speaker & Putri Leader of Malaysian Indian Congress, President-Women's Youth Wing) regarding the role of women in politics. The session was further led by Senator Dato Dr Nelson Ranganathan (Member of Parliament, Upper House, Malaysia) regarding the ruling coalition of the party in the federal government.

The session was achieved with an interacting Questioning session with two-sided participation.

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






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#### HOW SINGAPORE SOLVES IT'S WATER PROBLEMS

#### Outcomes


- The students were able to learn about the country's problem of limited water supply & its four national taps of water inventory.

- · The students were able to practically transform and perform big data analytics using real world scenario.

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
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#### INNOVATION IN RSAF

- · To develop an action step towards all four guiding objectives of sustainability.

### Description

The pre-arranged three teams presented their sustainability proposal on their assigned topics. Each team were given 30 minutes for their presentation and the teams were graded based on teamwork, creativity, sustainability of ideas, scalability of ideas, presentation style & the ability to captivate the audience.

The three green challenges allotted to the teams were: -

THE LION CITY	How can Singapore Government promote the use of clean energy in the near future?
RED DOT	How can Singapore Government achieve zero waste target for its waste collection by 2030?
TEMASEK	How can Singapore Government promote technologies to re- cycle water to meet its needs in the future?

Team Temasek started off their presentation by giving an overview of the Singapore's water history & the working of the NEWater plant with the 4 national taps. The team proposed the implementation of the NEWater technology & water recycling technologies in Chennai in addition to the continuation of NEWater technology and reprocess of water in Singapore.

Team Lion City realized that the growing issue of landfills and creation of clean energy could be battled through either of two measures.

1. Increasing the area of landfills

Improving Waste Disposal and Management Systems

Through various citations and references the team realized that almost 95% of the electricity for Singapore is imported from other countries. The idea was proposed using an engaging presentation. Following that the team also suggested solar film roofed cars that stores the solar power and uses it as a medium of fuel. The idea was presented as a prototype with in depth literature.

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Team Red Dot began their presentation by stating the common issues in Singapore, Chennai and India. Facts and Citations were presented by taking Germany, Taiwan and Japan as a base example for emerging as a zero-waste country. PWCS (Pneumatic Waste Conveyance System, Westcom Food Digester, Ecokari, Discontinuation of incineration waste, Conversion of traditional landfills into engineered landfills were some of the suggestions proposed by the team for the two countries to emerge as a zero-waste nation. Games and videos were presented by the team to make the presentation more interactive & creative.

Prizes were distributed for the teams based on their presentation style and fulfillment of criteria.

- The students were able to learn and understand the green challenges in an empirical foundation.

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






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### PROGRAM OUTCOME
