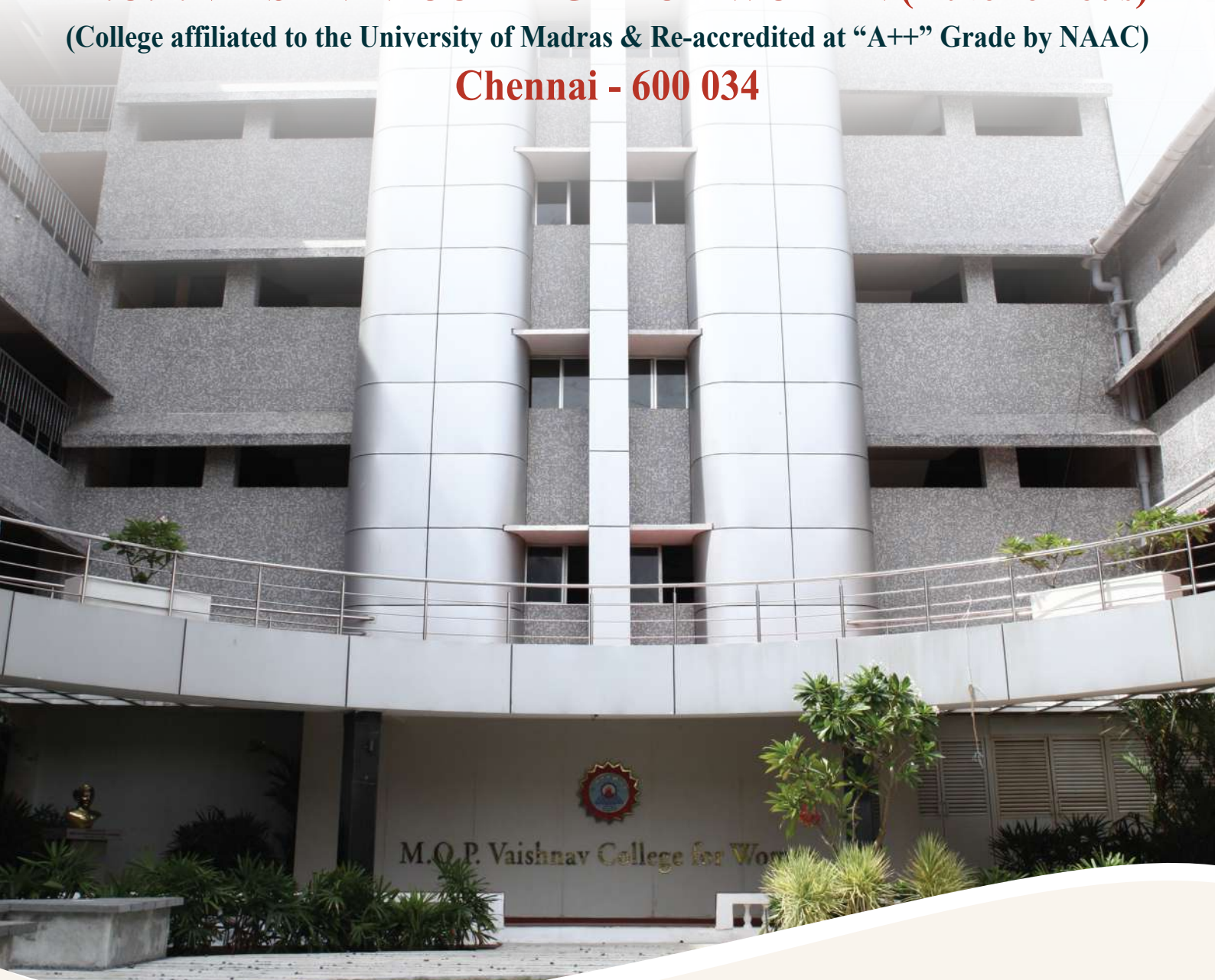

4. Curricular Initiatives

4.1 Curriculum Framework

The curriculum at M.O.P. Vaishnav College is designed to provide a holistic and future-ready education. The College has progressively enriched its curriculum framework during the year through the introduction of multiple cross-cutting themes and subject areas embedded across programmes.

Several innovations have been introduced this year: two domain-specific technical courses for each programme; guided access to a course on MOOC platforms such as Swayam, thus expanding the horizons of students; and Indian Knowledge Systems as a course for credit. Topics related to Sustainable Development Goals and Artificial Intelligence have been integrated into the curriculum wherever appropriate.

The curriculum also emphasises green initiatives, community engagement, ethics and values, and entrepreneurship, because the institution believes not only in academic competence but also in social responsibility and leadership skills.

4.2 Nurture Her Programme — MoU with Cognizant Technology Solutions Pvt. Ltd.

5. Diploma Programmes — 7th Convocation Day

Under its Centre of Excellence, the College offers Diploma programmes in industry-relevant areas. The 7th cohort of students received their M.O.P. diplomas this year. Ms. Sarawathi K, Secretary-General of the Madras Chamber of Commerce and Industry, presided over the convocation. The value of these diplomas is enhanced through collaborations with leading companies in the respective domains, such as the NSE (National Stock Exchange) Academy, Veranda IAS, and L & T Edutech.

6. Academic Performance

6.1 Undergraduate Batch 2022–2025 and Postgraduate Batch 2023–2025

A total of 1,420 students appeared for the final examinations across undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The results reflect the sustained commitment of the College to academic excellence:

- 24 students secured First Class with Exemplary Performance.
- 678 students secured First Class with Distinction.
- 596 students secured First Class.
- 10 programmes recorded a 100% pass rate.
- 11 programmes recorded a pass rate above 95%.

6.2 30th Graduation Day

The 30th Graduation Day was held on 10th March 2026, celebrating the achievements of the Undergraduate Batch 2021–2024 and the Postgraduate Batch 2022–2024. The ceremony was presided over by chief guest Prof. Alok Kumar Rai, Director, Indian Institute of Management, Kolkata. Key highlights of the graduating cohort are as follows:

- 1,309 graduates conferred degrees.
- 10 programmes recorded a 100% pass rate.
- 13 programmes recorded a pass rate above 90%.

7.2 Valedictory Ceremony

Held to recognise the efforts of the M.O.P. Sansad, the M.O.P. valedictory ceremony also sees awards conferred upon students for achievements other than student leadership. This year's valedictory ceremony, held on 18th March, was presided over by Dr. Manali Makarand Kshirsagar, Vice-chancellor, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj University, Nagpur.

8. Prominent Activities of Academic Programmes

8.1 M.B.A.

It was a memorable day on campus when the world-famous Dabbawallas of Mumbai visited for a session organised the MBA programme. This was the first edition of the S.C. Agarwal Endowment Lecture, held on 17th December 2025, on 'Six Sigma Operations and Total Quality Management,' delivered by a member of the renowned lunchbox delivery service.

Additionally, an International Conference on 'Sustainable Development Goals: Pathways to a Resilient Future' was conducted in Malaysia from 2nd to 4th February 2026, in association with Lincoln University College, Malaysia, bringing together scholars and practitioners to deliberate on global sustainability challenges.

8.2 M.A. Human Resource Management

The Department of Human Resource Management celebrated its Decennial Year through two flagship events. SPECTRA — HR Conclave 2025, themed on 'Sustainable HR', was held on 30th August 2025 and drew more than 90 industry delegates. The decennial milestone was further commemorated through the retrospective, 'SPECTRA X — A Decade of Empowering People', held on 7th February 2026.

8.3 B.B.A.

The B.B.A. Programmes organised the following events during the year. An International Seminar and Annual National Level Student Paper Presentation on the theme 'The Butterfly Effect in Management: Small Actions, Big Impact' was held on 19th September 2025. In addition, the B.B.A. Shift II Programme observed its Decennial Year with a Panel Discussion featuring alumnae achievers, titled 'From Campus to Career: The Road Ahead', held on 18th July 2025.

8.4 Department of Commerce

The Department of Commerce organised an International Seminar on the theme 'Finance, Governance and Markets: Emerging Paradigms in a VUCA World' on 26th July 2025. Further, a 7-Day Faculty Development Programme titled 'Skillsets for Future-Ready Teachers: Empowering Educators for Tomorrow's Challenges', conducted in association with the University of Madras, was held from 3rd to 10th November 2025.

The B.Com. Corporate Secretaryship Department celebrated its Tri-Decennial Year through 'Corpo Connect: Chapters of Change — Stories of Growth from Our Alumni', held on 18th February 2026.

8.5 Department of Computer Science and Information Technology

The Department conducted a 5-Day Faculty Development Programme on Robotic Process Automation on the UiPath Platform, in collaboration with ICT Academy, from 3rd to 7th November 2025.

The 7th Edition of the annual conference on 'Innovations and Emerging Trends in Communication, Computing and Information Technology for Sustainable Digital Transformation' was held on 6th and 7th February 2026.

8.6 B.Sc. Mathematics

Observing that artificial intelligence now occupies centre-stage among business leaders, thought-leaders and consumers, the Department of Mathematics organised a one-week online Faculty Development Program on 'Generative AI for Thought Leadership in Academia and Research,' from 11th to 17th June 2025.

8.7 Department of Communication and Media Studies

The B.A. Journalism Programme hosted an interactive session titled 'Algorithm Journalism: A Digital Toolkit for Modern Journalists' on 5th August 2025. The B.Sc. Visual Communication Department organised AdCon 2025 – It's about Ads, a 2-Day Advertising Symposium, on 23rd and 24th September 2025. The M.A. Public Policy Programme held a one-day international seminar on ‘Tibet – Ecology, Governance and Geostrategy,’ in collaboration with the Chennai Centre for China Studies, on 21st January, 2026.

8.11 Tamil, Hindi and English Programmes

The Tamil Programme organised the first Lakshmi Ananthachari Foundation Endowment Lecture on the theme 'Kalaiyilum Kalathilum Pengal' on 26th August 2025. The event featured two chief guests: Smt. Ilampirai Manimaran, speaker, writer, singer and Tamil enthusiast, and Shri. Iakoka N. Subramaniam, speaker and writer.

The Hindi Programme hosted the Vaishnav Gaurav Samman on 11th September 2025, honouring Prof. (Dr.) Nirmala S. Mourya, Former Vice-Chancellor of Veer Bahadur Singh Purvanchal University, Uttar Pradesh.

The English Programme organised a three-day poets’ meet, ‘Poetry with Prakriti’ from 6th to 8th January, 2026, featuring distinguished poets Dr. Srilata K., Ms. Shobana Kumar, Mr. Amal Mathew and Mr. Akhil Katyal.

9. Prominent Activities of Centres and Clubs

9.1 Institution’s Innovation Council (IIC)

The Institution’s Innovation Council (IIC) was very active during the year, organising a diverse range of entrepreneurship and innovation initiatives. A one-week Business on Campus programme was held from 21st to 25th July 2025. A 3-day Craft Demonstration and Awareness Programme was conducted in collaboration with the Ministry of Textiles, Government of India, from 8th to 10th December 2025.

The 28th Edition of M.O.P. Bazaar was held on 10th and 11th January 2026, inaugurated by Ms. Gayathri T, CEO of Kyn Technologies.

Two incubation and start-up bootcamp initiatives were also organised. Pitch Perfect, held on 12th December 2025 in collaboration with Implementers Retail Pvt. Ltd., offered a cash prize of Rs. 10,000 along with a 3-month mentorship programme. Start Up Utsav – a 3-phase Intra-Institutional Business Plan Competition – was held on 29th August 2025, 8th December 2025, and 12th March 2026.

The installation ceremony of the Executive Committee Members of the M.O.P. chapter of CII-Yi-Yuva, the youth wing of the Confederation of Indian Industry, was held on 9th February 2026. As the first order of business, the Chapter organised a design thinking workshop and B-Plan competition on 18th and 21st February, 2026.

As further illustration of a deep network with the industry, a programme on 'Election and Economy' was organised in collaboration with the Hindustan Chamber of Commerce on 14th February 2026, addressed by Padma Bhushan Shri. N. Gopalaswami, Former Chief Election Commissioner, Government of India.

9.2 Office of International Relations

The Office of International Relations facilitated significant international exposure for both faculty and students during the year.

A total of 55 students participated in international immersion and exchange programmes with partnering institutions across several countries.

9.3 Aspirants Club

The Aspirants Club organised two programmes to guide students towards civil services and competitive examinations. An event titled 'Aspiration to Achievements' was held on 25th July in collaboration with New Camp I.A.S. Academy, featuring Dr. P.M. Nair, IPS (Retd.), Former Director General of NDRF and Civil Defence, Government of India.

A UPSC / TNPSC Awareness Programme titled 'Vaagai Sooda Vaa' was organised on 7th August 2025 in collaboration with KingMakers IAS Academy and Kumudam Magazine, with Mr. Govinda Rao, I.A.S. and Mr. Srutunjay Narayanan, I.A.S. as resource-persons.

9.4 Teaching Assistantship Programme

M.O.P. runs a Teaching Assistantship Programme, providing a clear pathway for interested candidates, particularly postgraduate students, to take up teaching as a career, organising training sessions to help the aspirants clear the qualifying examinations. Training sessions for the year were conducted in the hybrid mode from January to March 2026. The programme engaged 14 trainees who received 35 hours of coaching by subject experts on the topic 'How to

Crack UGC–NET?' Notably, Ms. Jeevitha N of II M.Com. successfully cleared the UGC–NET examination with Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) during this period.

9.5 M.O.P. Library and Information Resource Centre

The Library and Information Resource Centre organised a number of events to foster a reading and research culture. The Author Speak Series, held in association with The New Indian Express, featured several distinguished authors, including Ms. Vani Pradeep, author of Soul Feeder 2.0 and winner of an International Literary Award in Non-Fiction, on 25th November.

A unique monthly series, 'Bibliotherapy Bytes,' was launched in association with the M.O.P. Community Radio Station, focusing on the therapeutic potential of reading, poetry and storytelling. The National Library Week Celebrations were observed from 21st to 27th November 2025. A National Symposium titled 'Know Your Library: Beyond the Stacks' was held on 29th January 2026 in association with EBSCO Information Services.

9.6 M.O.P. Sansad

The M.O.P. Sansad, the elected student governance body, held its Investiture Ceremony on 31st July 2025. The ceremony was presided over by Prof. Dr. Rita John, Registrar, University of Madras.

The Sansad members underwent a Mindful Leadership Training Programme on 1st July 2025 and a Young Leaders Programme titled 'From Intent to Impact' on 9th July and 13th August 2025. Parliamentary sessions, where the various student ministries' proposals were discussed, were held on 1st August and 5th December 2025.

Cultural events under the Student Cabinet included Abhilasha (30th August 2025), Shringar — 12th Edition (10th to 12th December 2025), and Jhankar — an inter-collegiate and inter-departmental event (19th to 21st December 2025).

On invitation by the Greater Chennai Corporation, the M.O.P. students got the opportunity to organise and perform at a mega open mic event organised by the M.O.P. Sansad at the newly renovated Victoria Public Hall.

9.7 Environmental and Knowledge Initiatives

A Symposium on Indian Knowledge Systems was organised on 1st September 2025, featuring Dr. Kiran Seth, Founder and CEO of SPICMACAY, as the keynote speaker. An E.V.S. Lecture

Series was held on 15th September 2025, and an educational visit to Adyar Eco Park was organised on 16th February 2026.

9.8 Anti-Drug Club and Road Safety Club

The Anti-Drug Club organised an Awareness Rally for International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking on 26th June 2025. The Road Safety Club conducted a Road Safety Awareness Campaign in collaboration with the NGO Alert on 18th February, and in collaboration with the Thunai Trust on 18th March.

9.9 Placement Cell

The Placement Cell facilitates on-campus recruitment through the academic year. In 2025-26, 74 companies visited the campus, and 200 students have been placed so far, with salary offers ranging from Rs. 6 – 12 lakh per annum.

The Cell also organised a Career Fair on 26th February 2026. More than 440 students seized the opportunity to explore their options, as 44 companies participated, resulting in 69 placements so far, with 150 students shortlisted.

A number of M.O.P.'s talented sportswomen received placement offers as a result of their sports records. Among others, Chess Grandmaster Vaishali R, a student of M.A. Communication, was placed in the Tamil Nadu Industrial Investment Corporation, and athlete Mahima Choudhary, of B.A. Sociology, was placed in the Border Security Force.

9.10 Alumni Engagement – M.O.P. Punarmilan

The College launched M.O.P. Punarmilan, a dedicated Alumni App, through a virtual launch ceremony on 27th October 2025. The launch was presided over by Prof. Mahesh V. Panchagnula, Head of the Centre of Excellence in Sports Science and Analytics, and former Dean of Alumni and Corporate Relations, IIT Madras.

The app boasts several engaging features, including job opportunities, mentorship requests, content that facilitates intra- and inter-domain networking, and inspiring content to promote long-term engagement.

18. Scholarships, Financial Support and Welfare Measures

The College demonstrated a strong commitment to student welfare through the disbursement of scholarships during the year. A total of 324 students benefited from scholarship support, with an aggregate scholarship amount of more than Rs. 1.75 crore distributed.

The 'Earn While You Learn' scheme was introduced, providing two students a year full tuition waiver, a stipend of Rs. 15,000 per month and practical work experience as campus interns.

Medical insurance for sports students was upgraded to enable them to avail of benefits up to Rs. 2 lakh, with the provision to increase it to Rs. 5 lakh in specific cases.

Through collaboration with MGM Hospitals, all staff members are eligible for a free master health checkup through a 'Namma Health Card' issued by the hospital.

A comprehensive leave policy was formulated, prioritising the staff cohort's needs, including categories such as casual leave, earned leave, medical leave, maternity and paternity leave, bereavement leave, Ph.D. leave, childcare leave, and special leave granted on a case-by-case basis.

- A kiosk was also set up to run 'Inkspire,' a photocopy and print stall operated by the beneficiaries of the 'Earn while you Learn' scheme.
- Two storerooms were created.
- 10 additional restrooms were built.
- UPI-based sanitary pad vending machines were installed at multiple places.
- A new reverse osmosis water purification plant with an enhanced capacity of 1,000 litres per hour, equipped with seven dispensing point, was installed.
